- [AREDN](#) (Amateur Radio Emergency Data Network) is a project aimed at using wifi devices flashed with an [open firmware](#) to create a computer network independent of the internet. Since hams have access to sections of the [2.4 GHz](#) and [5.8 GHz](#) bands that regular wifi devices don't, those channels are quieter and longer distances can be achieved with directional antennas.
- [NARA](#) on Vancouver Island is doing a lot of work to create this network in our area, and more people on the West Coast have started experimenting with some of the equipment.
- [This message board](#) is very active with local hams and is the best place to ask questions.
- [This map](#) shows the nodes that are live in the area.
